The 38th International Film Festival of India, IFFI Goa had rolled the red carpet, as the State of Goa geared up to celebrate the movies in the true spirit of world class entertainment from November 23rd to December 3rd. The event synergized global participation, high profile glamour and top notch entertainment with world renowned national and international celebrities walking the red carpet. IFFI 2007 showcased a repertoire of critically acclaimed international films, animation seminars, film museum and music concert to the delegates and the public.



Since the IFFI formed a part of FSC curriculum under the subject head of 'World Cinema', each student was supposed to see a minimum of 20 films, belonging to different places across the world, different genre and in various languages and analyze them on different aspects given by the Dean, Prof. Achyut Vaze. As the film festival was put under the subject head of 'World Cinema', it added an element of seriousness to it. Thus began the race and competition of who watches the maximum number of films in a



week's time.

Some of the movie buffs from FLAME itself managed to catch up 6 movies in a day too to keep the adrenalin running in the race to watch the maximum number of films. From Cuba to Italy, France to Portugal, from Europe to India, it was a culmination of diverse origins coming together on a common platform. The best feature of the fest was that the audience had an opportunity to have a question and answer sessions with some of the national and international directors and actors after the screening of their films. It gave the students an insight to their point of views and opened new aspects of film making as well.

Directors, film makers, producers, actors, press, students from different media schools, name it and all were present there.

From what had been a schedule of 9 to 5 lectures, a sudden transformation into a schedule that required one to 'eat movies, drink movies and sleep movies' was more than welcomed by the students & was a totally different experience. It has given them all a totally new dimension to the way they look at the industry that they are going to be a part of a couple of years from now.
