KHASI WOMAN THREATENED BY ASSAM RESIDENTS OVER LAND FOR WATER TANK PROJECT

After courteously providing their land for the construction of a water tank under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) program, a Khasi permanent inhabitant family named Juki Marwet from Barapathar faced threats from two Assam inhabitants, Tutu Majumdar and Nurul Islam, in a worrying turn of events close to Assam's border. When the Rangbah Shnong of Barapathar, Soni Nongtri, started building the water tank on the land, the situation came to surface.

Village leaders further disclosed that Tutu Majumdar and Nurul Islam had a track record of interfering with local development initiatives.

DENGUE OUTBREAK NOT STOPPING IN BIHAR, 289 NEW PATIENTS FOUND IN 24 HOURS; SECOND DEATH IN MUZAFFARPUR.

In the last 24 hours, 289 new cases of dengue have been found increasing the count to 4182 just alone in this month. There are about 200 plus patients being treated in 12 colleges. Muzaffarpur saw it second death due to the dengue outbreak.

The deceased was a resident of Kanti, aged 43 years. The patient had settled here from Nagaland. Around 15th September he was admitted to the hospital for symptoms of dengue and by 17th August his health started deteriorating.

166 POSTS OF DOCTORS VACANT IN KUPWARA, PATIENTS SUFFER

The frontier district of Kupwara is suffering from a significant shortage of doctors, which is impacting the quality of health treatment throughout the district. According to the information available, 322 of the 488 sanctioned doctor positions are now filled, while the remaining 166 have been empty for quite some time. Administrative officers, consultants, medical officers, dental surgeons, allopathic specialists, allopathic medical officers, and ISM medical officers are among the vacant positions. People are upset with the administration for neglecting to fill vacant positions in the district.

CAUVERY WATER DISPUTE: KARNATAKA ORDERED TO RELEASE 5,000 CUSECS OF WATER TO TAMIL NADU FOR 15 DAYS

Most of South India is facing the brunt of the El Nino effect, forcing a drastic reduction in the seasonal monsoons. Being an agricultural country, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu both depend on the river Cauvery as their primary water source. In this phase of water scarcity, Karnataka has refused to release water to Tamil Nadu. A board meeting between the two states was called 2 days ago. 5,000 cusecs of water were ordered to be released for a span of 15 days, after which the order would be reconsidered.

BUDGET PROGRESSIVELY COMING DOWN; CENTRE AIMS TO DILUTE MGNREGS, SAYS KERALA MINISTER M.B. RAJESH

Kerala's Minister for Local Self-Government, M.B. Rajesh, has criticized the central government for its poor allocation of funds for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) as the state has been struggling with fulfilling the demand effectively. For the past few years, the funds allocated have been reducing and the Kerala government has had to keep asking for more funds.

He accused the Modi led government of diluting the importance of MGNREGA and stated the need for more funds as the many of the workers under the scheme are women who sole breadwinners for their families.

The villagers are distressed due to this. 13 farmers in the Sorai area had their electricity lines cut and stolen last night from their farms. Almost 4,000 feet of cable were removed during the course of the night.

Farmers from Sorai went to the police station in Kotwali and reported the issue.


GADCHIROLI POLICE FOILED NAXALITES' ASSASSINATION PLOT

PUNJAB'S PENDING RDF: SUPREME COURT HEARING AGAINST CENTRE ON SEPTEMBER 25

After repeated requests by CM Mann's Punjab government, the Central government has failed to release Rural Development Funds (RDF) that have not been released to Punjab for over 4 cropping seasons. While Mann's government had requested for RDF release on 11th July 2023, they received no response which is when the government filed a Supreme Court case against the Union Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution with the hearing set on 25th September 2023. The Ministry allegedly owes Punjab Rs. 3,622 crores in RDF funds, which has resulted in the suspension of rural development work in Punjab like that of building roads.



RAJASTHAN: PARVATI RIVER SWEEPS AWAY 3 PEOPLE IN KOTA AFTER WATER LEVEL BEGAN RISING SUDDENLY

According to authorities, three persons in Rajasthan's Kota district went missing after being washed away in the Parvati river close to Kishanpura village. The three people said that the incident happened on Saturday afternoon when they were fishing and taking a bath in the overflowing river. The river's water level reportedly suddenly began rising and the three persons, along with two others named Kishan and Neelu, were swept away by the strong current of the water. The SHO said Kishan and Neelu were able to swim to the shore, while the three others went missing.

This demand arises from the agricultural activities in nearby villages like Vedrapuliyankulam, Sakhilipatti, Chinnasakhilipatti, Tenpapanji, Vellaparapatti, Vadapajanji, Manapatti, Keezhakuilgudi, and Melakuilgudi, where hundreds of farmers cultivate various vegetables, including Kathari, tomato, chili, and onions, across several acres of land. The farmers seek government support to ensure the availability of these crucial seedlings at a full subsidy, which would contribute to their agricultural endeavors in the region.

TN SETS UP RS 100CR FUND TO BOOST STARTUP INVESTMENTS IN STARTUP INVESTMENTS IN STATE

The fund set up by MK Stalin is to be managed by professionals along with the government's support with a predetermined percentage based on the fund's targets.

The policy that follows the 2018-23 policy lays a strong emphasis on social justice and calls for creating a democratised startup ecosystem, as well as for the "development of both technologically groundbreaking and socially impactful enterprises by individuals from all walks of life"





COUPLE HACKED TO DEATH IN KRISHNA DISTRICT OVER ALLEGED DISPUTES

In a chilling incident at Ayyanki village, Krishna district, a couple, Veeranki Varalakshmi and Veeranki Veer Krishna, were ruthlessly hacked to death, believed to be a result of ongoing disputes. The gruesome murders occurred on a public road and near the Panchayat office. Kuchipudi police are investigating, with suspicions pointing towards Veeranki Ganesh and his siblings. ADDRESSING ISSUES BY ELECTING WOMEN IN TRIPURA

Tripura was the first among the 8 northeastern states to have 50% reservation for women in the 3-tier Gram Panchayats and urban local bodies in 2010, leading to women's dominance in rural as well as urban areas.

According to analysts, reservation for women in local bodies has made women active participants in the political arena as well as in policy making.

It is now being suggested that a third of the Tripura Assembly's 60 seats may be reserved for women and out of the two Lok Sabha seats that Tripura has, one seat should be reserved for women.

GOVT STRESSES ON CONTROLLING DENGUE VECTOR

After a 28-year-old doctor diagnosed with dengue died, a meeting was held at Nabanna with the state secretariat for West Bengal to discuss the increase in dengue cases in Parganas, Howrah, Hooghly, Nadia, Murshidabad, Malda and South 24 Parganas districts. The meeting involved senior officials from various departments, including Health, Urban Development, Rural Development, PWD, Kolkata Municipal Corporation, district authorities, and medical college principals. It was decided that anyone with a fever that lasts longer than two days must get tested for dengue.

ELEPHANT DEATH: RAILWAYS-FOREST DEPARTMENT AGREE TO USE AI TECHNOLOGY TO PREVENT ELEPHANT DEATHS

A year ago, the 'Intrusion Detection System' (IDS) was introduced on the North East Frontier Railway to prevent wild elephant deaths on railway tracks. Now, the railway and forest department plan to expand this technology across 11 elephant corridors in Alipurduar. This decision follows a meeting of 20 state forest and railway officials in Alipurduar. The IDS technology uses optical fibre along railway lines to alert gatekeepers, station masters, loco pilots, and guards when elephants approach, reducing accidents. The technology will first cover North Eastern states starting from West Bengal and eventually expand nationwide, with a budget of 79.12 crore allocated by Railways.
