AP IST IN COUNTRY TO COMPLETE LAND SURVEY IN 4,000 VILLAGES

Andhra Pradesh has become the first Indian state to complete land reservation operations in 4,000 villages through the 'YSR Jagananna Saswata Bhu Hakku, Bhu Raksha Scheme'. The initiative provides digital land records with precise latitude and longitude coordinates, ensuring accuracy down to 10 centimeters. The government offers survey stones at no cost to mark agricultural land boundaries, ensuring tamper-proof documents. Land records are safeguarded from unauthorized changes, preventing double registrations. The scheme includes regular updates, mutation services, and subdivision processes before registration. 95% of the state's 17,595 villages have been covered, with the remaining 624 villages set to be completed by October 15.

ASSAM

ASSAM INTRODUCES DELIMITATION OF PANCHAYAT CANDIDACY

The delimitation of panchayat elections has been started by the Assam government. The Assam Panchayat Bill, 2023, which aims to delimit the assemblies of the Gaon Panchayat, Anchalik Panchayat, and Zilla Parishad, was introduced by Panchayat and Rural Development Minister Ranjeet Kumar Dass on 11th September. The Bill stipulates that the president and vice-president of the Gaon Panchayat would not be elected directly. The Ward Sabhas, which each consist of a Gaon Panchayat, would nominate members who would be viable for these positions.

The Bill also declares people who violated the minimum legal age of marriage ineligible. The minimum qualification for Ward Sabha members now is 10th pass for general quota and 12th pass for Anchalik Panchayat and Zilla Parishad members.

Muralidhar studies while he is a guest at the inn. On the 16th, the call was received, informing that her son Sumit Kumar was arrested for stealing a motorbike. NTPC STARTS PREPARATION: TENDER FOR SOLAR MODULES AT KHAWDA PARK

The work of the hybrid renewable energy park near the India-Pakistan border near Khawda is currently underway. Various government and private companies have been commissioned in the world's largest hybrid renewable energy park. In this National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) is also setting up a solar power project here. The company is an Indian central public sector undertaking owned by the Ministry of Power and the Government of India.

MICRO-MONITORING IN KARNAL RURAL AREAS

The administration has begun preparing for village-level micro-monitoring in an effort to decrease the number of stubble burning incidents in the district. A team at the village level, consisting of the village secretary, patwari, and agriculture officer, will educate farmers about the drawbacks of burning stubble by holding meetings. Anish Yadav, Deputy Commissioner, made this statement to representatives of the various departments on Friday during a workshop on managing stubble at the Dr Mangal Sen Auditorium in the city.

RESIDENTS OF HAJIN TOWN HOLD PROTEST FOR BETTER ROAD IN MARKET

Traders and villagers in Hajin, Bandipora district, north Kashmir, held a silent sit-in protest on Wednesday with the aim of obtaining better road conditions in the market area. Protesters claimed that despite promises of action, the government had ignored the road. "We are losing business and health as a result of this neglected road. The government has broken its promises and has abandoned us," Mushtaq Ahmad, president of the Traders Federation Hajin, told Greater Kashmir.

DROUGHT: IN BELGAUM-BAGALAKOT DISTRICTS, THERE IS NO HELL SIGHT, AGRICULTURAL LANDS ARE PARCHED, HERE IS THE COMPLETE REPORT

The districts of Belgaum and Bagalkot of north Karnataka are facing the delayed brunt of the missing monsoon showers. Over 2 lakh hectares of agricultural land have seen deficient levels of rainfall, insufficient for crop growth. Crops such as cotton and onion, which must have completed budding, haven't even reached that stage yet. Other crops such as ragi and paddy show stunted or inefficient growth, making the crop of no financial viability during the harvest stage Barren lands of sown fields paint a depressing image of the farmer's life.

KERALA

PROGRESS OF JAL JEEVAN MISSION GOING AT SNAIL'S PACE AS KERALA GOVT DEFAULTS ON PAYMENT

The central government's 'Jal Jeevan mission' which aims at providing adequate and safe drinking water to rural households through individual tap connections, has been progressing slower than expected in Kerala. Launched in 2020, its target to reach 69.92 lakh households by 2024 is seeming difficult to achieve as a mere total of 35.53 lakh households have been covered so far. The reasons for delay are mentioned as delayed permission to lay pipes in the National Highways and Forest region.

The project contractors have not been receiving their payments due to the delay in the government's disbursement of funds. Kerala water resource department promised the distribution by September 17.



MADHYA PRADESH

INDORE- FARMERS PROTEST WITH TRACTORS IN MP AGAINST THE ACQUISITION OF LAND FOR THE INDORE-PITHAMPUR ECONOMIC CORRIDOR PROJECT.

On September 14th, farmers from over 16 villages in Indore, protested using tractors in response to the opposition Congress's call for an end to the state government's proposed Indore-Pithampur Economic Corridor project's acquisition of what they allege is fertile agricultural land. Many demonstrators vowed not to sell their productive properties, claiming that the government's reimbursement for land was less than the going rate. The tractor march was stopped by officials due to traffic congestion.

It was mentioned by authorities that the project will bring in investments worth Rs. 15,000 crore and create more than a lakh direct and indirect jobs.

MAHARASHTRA

MAHA GOVT ANNOUNCES RS 59,000 CRORE PACKAGE FOR MARATHWADA DEVELOPMENT

Maharashtra's Eknath Shinde-led government announced a Rs 59,000 crore special package for the backward Marathwada region. The decision was made during a cabinet meeting in Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar, commemorating Marathwada Mukti Din's 75th anniversary. The package includes 14,000 crore for irrigation projects in drought-prone central Maharashtra. Eight districts, including Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, will benefit from this initiative, irrigating eight lakh hectares of agricultural land.

SOCIAL MEDIA POST TRIGGERS VIOLENCE AT VILLAGE IN MAHARASHTRA'S SATARA

A social media post which allegedly contained offensive remarks about divine figures sparked violence between two communities at Pusesavali village in Satara. Houses were set on fire. Shops and places of religious worship were attacked. A civil engineer belonging to the village lost his life in the attack, and several other people were injured as well. The village is located about 25km from Karad, an urban centre in Satara. After the incident, the movement of vehicles was restricted to and from the village, as the police officers took stock of the situation.

MANIPUR: VILLAGE IN IMPHAL WEST ATTACKED BY GUNMEN, BOMBS HURLED, NO ONE INJURED

Manipur faced a new incident of violence when unidentified gunmen suspected to be from terror groups attacked people and hurled at least ten bombs in the Koutruk village in a district in Imphal West. Fortunately, no one was injured. This violence comes after unidentified armed men, also suspected to be members of terror groups, killed three persons from the tribal community on Tuesday morning near Kharam Vaiphei village in Kangpokpi, a district near Imphal.

ODISHA: GOVT SOUNDS ALERT AFTER SCRUB TYPHUS CLAIMS 5 LIVES IN BARGARH

A recent breakout of Scrub Typhus has put lives of 12 people in danger and taken lives of 5 children in the Bargarh district of Odisha. The 12 patients are being treated at the VSS Medical Institute (VIMSAR) in Sambalpur. There are two cases reported in most districts per day, and VIMSAR is itself doing atleast a 100 tests per day with a 5% positivity rate. Fortunately, the mortality rate is quite low at 6%, hence only the most critical patients are being admitted to the hospital. The Symptoms for Scrub Typhus present in the form of a high fever, vomiting, body aches, and muscle ache, and it is spread by the bite of infected larval mites. The director of Public health, Niranjan Mishra, has asked the districts to intensify the preventive procedures and report daily on positive cases and their statuses.

WITH NO HELP, DHAKKA BASTI VILLAGERS IN JALANDHAR FORCED TO RECOVER BRICKS FROM RIVERBED

In Dhakka Basti, a village in Punjab that the July flooding has devasted, villagers are heading back to the flooded site to retrieve bricks and household belongings from their homes. While they live in makeshift houses in Null Village, their impoverishment has left them with nothing to survive on. Empty promises of compensation and relief have led villagers to take matters into their own hands, leading to the death of one villager who drowned while trying to recover bricks. The family of the villager has been compensated 4.5 lakhs by the government, but other villagers continue to recover bricks in flooded regions.

12 KILLED AS TRUCK RAMS INTO BUS IN RAJASTHAN; ONE ARRESTED

A moving truck collided with a private bus parked on the Jaipur-Agra national highway-21 near Bharatpur district of Rajasthan. The incident took place around 5 a.m. on 13th September,2023. Twelve people passed away in this accident and fifteen people sustained injuries. Later that day ,the accused truck driver was apprehended by the police. The twelve fatalities included five men and seven women. The people on board the bus were devotees, who had come on a religious pilgrimage from Gujarat in Bharatpur.

MACHINES WORTH RS.I.5 CRORES GUTTED

Machines worth 1.5 crores were gutted after a fire broke out in a weaving unit of a textile mill at Vettaikaran Kuttai near Kaniyur. The mill, owned by K Periyasamy aged 64, went up in flames due to a short circuit within the unit while 30 employees were inside the mill. All of them managed to escape and alerted the nearby authorities, who doused the fire in a matter of two hours. The mill had 48 weaving machines, each cost Rs.50 lakhs. 1.5 Crore worth of machines were lost in the fire and the total loss stands at Rs.3 Crores as informed by Mr. Periyasamy.

TELANGANA MAN SEEKS HELP FROM AUTHORITIES TO RECLAIM PROPERTY DIVIDED AMONG SONS

Nomula Rajaiah, an elderly man from Thimmapur village in Telangana's Karimnagar district, seeks help from authorities to reclaim property divided among his sons. He approached them on Monday, distressed by his sons' neglect. Rajaiah alleged that his younger son and daughterin-law, who were providing meals, stopped due to warnings from the elder son's family. Visibly emotional, he submitted a petition during the weekly 'Praja Vani' program on September 11. A total of 268 petitions were received that day, according to District Collector B Gopi, who assured thorough investigation and action on each. Officials pledged to examine Rajaiah's case carefully and take necessary steps.

20% 'DIDIS' FROM SELF-HELP GROUPS ACHIEVE MILLIONAIRE STATUS

Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha shared major news on Independence Day, announcing that 20% of the 'Didis' from the state's Self Help Group have become millionaires. Currently, Tripura has over 46 thousand self help groups that encompass more than 4.13 lakh women. A further 80 thousand women are slated to join these groups in the coming year. The World Bank invested 1,400 crore rupees to the Tripura Rural Economy Growth and Sustainable Service Delivery project that is aimed at catalyzing development in the lives of tribal communities.

ALL SCHOOLS TILL CLASS I2 TO REMAIN SHUT IN BARABANKI DUE TO HEAVY RAIN

Uttar Pradesh has experienced severe and continuous heavy rainfall in recent days, resulting in loss of life and widespread damage. District and city administrations across the state have responded to the adverse weather conditions by temporarily closing schools. On September 13, 2023, the District Magistrate of Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh, issued an order to close all schools in rural areas, due to heavy rain, lightning, and waterlogging. This closure encompasses government, non-government-aided, and private schools catering to students from pre-primary to class 12.
