


GOMAC 2021 APAC WINNERS



She is analysing secondary data, including reports and surveys on company websites. Simultaneously, she is also in conversation to interview the CEO of a marketing agency to help her with more data which will be helpful in her dissertation project.





MEKHALA'S DISSERTATION TOPIC IS "TRACING INTERNAL MIGRATION OF ECONOMICALLY IMPORTANT CITIES OF INDIA".

She plans to use the Indian census data from 1881 to 2011, specifically, the migration tables which classify migrants as the individuals who reside in a city different from their birthplace are being used. This information is being collected for migrants in cities which are economic hubs such as Mumbai, Pune, Surat and Ahmedabad.


Students of FLAME University had the chance to interact with the team of Rashmi Rocket in a recent fireside chat.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Team Carrota launched a pilot campaign on campus for 3 days and ensured that they spread the word on campus. They developed and placed posters and banners and ran various social media campaigns as well.

Team Stella developed an offering that let one preserve a special moment in a star map that they could treasure for life. Stella offered star map frames in various sizes and designs. Over the 3-day stall, the team received 30 orders in total.

Team Squad Games organised an exciting tri-sport event - SQUAD WARS 2021. This was a pilot project for their business plan of online turf booking services, Squad Games. Students formed a squad of four members each to compete for a trophy and exciting cash prizes. There were 18 teams in total, and each squad put their all-around athletic abilities to the test through a relay race.









TAMID AT FLAME

TAMID group, a non profit organisation has tied up with FLAME University. This will be beneficial for the undergraduate students looking to expand their network and professional skills through interactions with the Israeli economy. There are 60+ TAMID chapters on college campuses in Australia, China, Canada, Israel and US Universities like Babson College, Boston University, Brown, Cornell University, Harvard University, Indiana University, and MIT.

At FLAME, students will learn the fundamentals of investing, consulting and gain rewarding professional experience through real-life consulting projects with Israeli start-ups. They will also get access to managing TAMID's stock portfolio, competing in stock pitches and can explore internship opportunities through an eight-week summer fellowship program in Israel.



DISCOVER INDIA PROGRAM

At FLAME University, we believe that knowledge must move beyond classrooms, out in the open, in reality and in experience. Therefore, it is our constant endeavour to ensure that our students are exposed to diverse practical and experiential learning opportunities throughout their time at FLAME.

The Discover India Program (DIP), our flagship student-led initiative, is a one-ofits-kind program that primes our young undergraduate students to study and research India's rich traditions and its incredible sociocultural heritage. As a part of DIP, students travel across the length and breadth of the country, including remote villages to gain a first-hand experience of Indian customs, traditions and culture.

Each year, students work in teams of 10 to 15 members and operate under the guidance of a faculty mentor. Following months of planning, intensive fieldwork, academic research, data accumulation and their interpretation, the effort culminates in a creative manner, with the students presenting their findings through a Project Report, an Exhibit and a Presentation. Over the years, around 1000 students have completed more than 100 projects traversing 19 states, 2 union territories across the country and 4 countries globally.

BEFORE THE FLOOD


DOCUMENTARY - BEFORE THE FLOOD
