Dear Reader,


I am delighted to present the tenth edition of our newsletter, dedicated to sharing the latest updates from FLAME University.







India Series Webinar: The Nature of Endangerment in India – Tigers, 'Tribes', Extermination & Conservation (1818-2020)

Prof. Jain and Prof. Rashkow led a discussion on Prof. Rashkow's book, which critically examines conservation efforts involving India's Indigenous people. The session questioned whether India's tribes are genuinely endangered and challenged the comparison of their extinction threat to that of wildlife. The book provides a global intellectual history of preservation efforts, critiques the discourse of human endangerment, and calls for the decolonization of narratives surrounding Indigenous survival.

Public Talk on Communicating Ethics

Dr. Roy delivered a thought-provoking talk on ethics. He presented an experimental scenario where participants engaged in pre-play communication and message exchanges with real consequences. The experiment compared two ethical models and introduced an axiomatic approach to understanding personal ethics.

Leadership For Equity (LFE) Conference

The two-day research symposium, "Transforming Educational Systems at Scale for 21st Century Skills: Ensuring Equity Amidst Change," focused on how systems change can reshape Indian education to equip learners with the skills needed for the 21st century. The event brought together students, researchers, and education practitioners to share knowledge, explore best practices, and discuss future directions through the lens of a systems approach.



TROPICSU Workshop

FLAME University's Centre for Sustainability, Environment and Climate Change (CSECC), in collaboration with TROPICSU, hosted a one-day workshop titled "Climate Change in Your Classroom: A Workshop for Teachers of All Disciplines." The event brought together school teachers from diverse fields, equipping them with tools to incorporate climate change topics into their teaching through innovative inter and trans-disciplinary approaches. Organized in partnership with Pune Climate Warrior, the workshop empowered educators from cities across Maharashtra, including Pune, Nagpur, and Sangli, with hands-on strategies to raise climate awareness in classrooms.







Workshop on Forgotten Workers Shaping India's Modernity

Dr. Sarah Melsens, a Marie Sklodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellow at FLAME University, led a workshop and open house as part of her research project, "Omitted from History: How Workers on India's Building Sites Mediated Twentieth-Century Modernity." An architect, engineer, and historian, Dr. Melsens has spent over a decade researching Pune's urban development prior to the 1990s. Her project highlights the often-overlooked contributions of engineers, contractors, and construction workers in shaping Pune's architectural landscape and modernity.

Don Norman, widely regarded as the father of user experience and a member of the advisory body for FLAME University's design program, visited the campus to engage with students and share his expertise in Human-Centered Design. His insights sparked curiosity and innovation among students, faculty, and industry experts. 
